Sheena started checking in on Phoenix every day — driving her to school, picking her up, and getting her into the habit of walking there and back.



VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: DANIELLE, THE BRIDGE DROP-IN

The Bridge Drop-In is our first point of contact with kids in the North End. Four nights a week, through games, worship and conversation, we seek to build a relational bridge between them and positive, Christian role models... like Danielle!

Q: What do you like most about volunteering at The Bridge?

A: What I love most is the kids. They are the reason I keep coming back. They deserve love, and if I'm able to make their day just a little brighter, it is definitely worth it.

Q: How has volunteering at The Bridge impacted you personally?

A: Instead of coming with a mindset of "What can I get out of this?"; instead, I ask God "How can I be fully present and serve these kids?" When you live for something higher than yourself, servitude isn't a chore. It's a joyful sacrifice.

Q: How has volunteering at ICYA changed your opinions or perceptions about the North End?

A: I have discovered just how broken and hurting the North End really is. But I've also discovered how much resilience and perseverance there is. The North End is bruised and cracked but not shattered. It is possible to put the pieces back together. These precious children need compassion, not judgement. Grace, not condemnation. Encouragement, not ridicule. They are precious jewels in our heavenly Father's eyes.


Q: What would you say to someone who is thinking of volunteering at ICYA?

HELP INNER CITY KIDS STAY IN SCHOOL THIS FALL

Kids like Siena are embarrassed to go to school because they don't have clothes that fit. Your generosity can change that today.

Siena is all too familiar with hard things.

She lives in a high-risk, crime-filled community with her single mother. Recently, she suffered the devastating loss of her brother.

Both mom and daughter are trying to help out, but money is still very tight. Food and rent take up most of their income.
